CURRICULUM

Robinson School's highly competitive, rigorous, and balanced college preparatory academic program emphasizes the development of strong communication and critical, flexible thinking skills, and prompts students to connect and apply content knowledge. Beginning in the primary grades, students experience learning activities that foster problem solving and creativity, as well as leadership and character building. In addition to the English language curriculum, Spanish is a requirement at all grade levels. Middle School begins our French Acquisition program. Strong and interconnected STEM opportunities, Design courses and Visual and Performing Arts offerings round out the Robinson program. Technology is at the forefront of student life and learning at Robinson. Classrooms and labs are state-of-the-art. Our Bring Your Own Device program begins in 4th grade, preparing students with the skills needed to succeed both now and in the future. Teachers embed the use of the Canvas LMS and Microsoft 365 tools for education into their classroom at all levels, integrating teaching practices that continue to uphold the honor Robinson earns as a Microsoft Showcase School. Classes foster intellectual curiosity and promote collaborative learning. Robinson School's service learning and leadership program supports character education with a globally-minded focus. Championship teams, a diverse student population and full range of extracurricular activities help provide a well-rounded education.

- *Elementary Program*: a nurturing environment that provides a solid foundation in academics and develops students as life-long learners.
- *Middle School Program*: offers excellent academics and specialized support for adolescents making the transition to Middle School.
- *Upper School Program*: a challenging college preparatory program tailored to the academic goals and needs of each student.
- *Pathways*: a college preparatory program for students with diagnosed mild, language-based learning differences.
- *International Baccalaureate (IB) World School*: an authorized school for the Primary Years Programme (PYP), Middle Years Programme (MYP) and Diploma Programme (DP).

IB Diploma Program and Advanced Placement

Robinson School offers a range of certified Diploma Programme, both Higher Level and Standard Level, and Advanced Placement courses to qualified students through a process of application and interview. Our professional instructors are certified by the IBO and/or College Board. CAMPUS AND FACILITIES

Our campus is a beautiful expanse of tranquility located in the heart of the Condado area in San Juan, Puerto Rico. Spanning 4.5 acres of land, Robinson School is just one block from the ocean. Its buildings are representative of historical Spanish architecture. Our learning spaces are modern and inviting, reflecting our goal of providing a world-class education to our students. Facilities include: 7 science labs, an Innovation Lab, 2 libraries, 3 computer labs, 3 art rooms, 4 performance spaces, 2 playgrounds, gymnasium, cafeteria, PTO Store, PTO & Seniors Kiosk, auditorium, teacher resource room, faculty room, kitchen, and infirmary. Our residential building includes 10 rooms, 2 kitchens and 2 living rooms.
